Veterans to get Wall and Walk of Honor in Alpine

There can never be enough accolades, memorials or thanks to the Veterans who have fought gallantly to keep the USA safe and protect the freedom afforded the nation under the constitution.

Dan Foster, past president of the Alpine Kiwanis and chairperson of the Alpine Veterans Wall of Honor Committee, along with the Alpine Kiwanis, brought up the idea a few years

ago to honor our veterans. Over the years other Kiwanis members came on board to the idea. The Alpine Veterans Wall of Honor Committee includes Herb Cawthorne, Larry Curtis, Bob Jackson, Dave Keibert, Ron Laxson, Al Martinez and Pat Stalker, the current president of the Alpine Kiwanis.

Through the combined efforts of Foster, the Alpine Kiwanis, the Alpine Community Center and the Viejas Band of Kumeyaay Indians, plans are underway for A Veterans Wall of

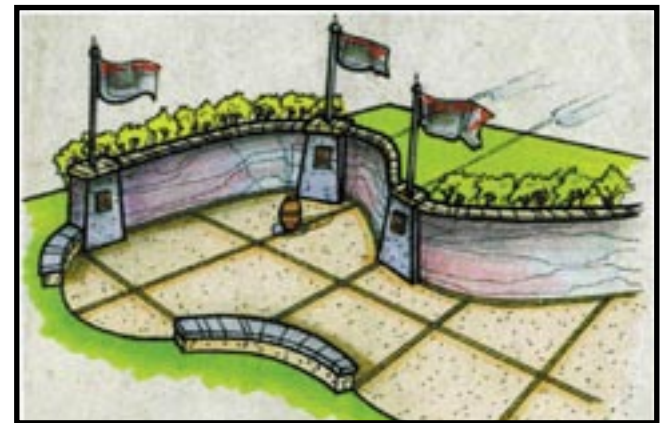
Honor to earmark the corner of the Alpine Community Center. "The initial idea was for a boulder," Jackson said. "Eventually it was decided to have a Wall and Walk of Honor."

The wall, which will be visually present on Alpine Boulevard, will feature spaces to immortalize the names of those from our community who have proudly served. Any veteran who served honorably in active duty and is a resident of the back country is eligible to have his/her name on the

wall. "This wall is designed to honor both Veterans who have passed away and those who are still alive today," Foster said. "Too many of them are dying everyday so it's important we complete this project to honor them."

A donation of \$50 will secure a name on the Wall of Honor. Eventually bricks will make up a Walk of Honor where locals whose family members served may donate to have their name on the walk. The price for the bricks is undetermined at this point. Donations should be made payable to the Alpine Community Center, a 501 (c) (3) corporations and are deductible as a charitable contribution. The Wall of Honor Advisory Committee will oversee that all funds donated are spent for developing, designing, building and maintaining the Wall of Honor. Make sure to designate a contribution is for the "Wall of Honor."

Jackson is excited that the Alpine community has been

very responsive to the plans for the Wall. "We're still finalizing plans with the architect but some of the plans include making room for 6,000 names and having it lighted at night so we can fly flags," he said. "The community has been very responsive to this project with many businesses and residents offering financial support as well as for labor and supplies."

A fundraiser kicks off this project on April 21 at 6 p.m. at Vie-

jas' Dream Catcher lounge. To make a reservation for the fundraiser or to make a donation to the Wall of Honor, send an email to wallofhonor@alpinekiwanis.org or call Sue Roff, Executive Director, Alpine Community Center at (619) 445-7330.

"This is going to be a great event and lots of things are planned for an inspirational and fun evening," Foster said. "We encourage the community to come out and be proud of all who have served us."

Current water allocation continues until 2011 Lakeside round-up

The Board of Directors for the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, the San Diego County Water Authority's largest supplier, voted to continue the present level of water supply allocations for its member agencies through June 30, 2011, pending a final review of statewide water supply conditions in May. MWD also approved successive 7.5 percent increases in water rates for calendar years 2011 and 2012.

In response, Claude A. "Bud" Lewis, Chairman of the Board of Directors for the

San Diego County Water Authority, has issued the following statement:

"Our water supplies are still being constrained by regulatory restrictions in Northern California. MWD's decision to continue allocations for a second year means water supply shortages likely will continue in the San Diego region into 2011. It's important that residents and businesses continue to use water efficiently and follow local water use restrictions in effect.

Next month the Water Authority board will review water supply conditions and decide

the appropriate shortage allocation level in San Diego County.

MWD's decision to raise rates also means the costs to provide our region with a reliable water supply are escalating. The price San Diego County residents and businesses pay for water will rise next year, and again in 2012. We are still analyzing what the exact impact on the Water Authority will be. In May, the Water Authority Board will determine its rates and charges for calendar year 2011 based

on MWD's rate increases and other factors. A public hearing and final approval of the Water Authority's rates and charges will take place in June.

These latest water supply and water rate developments reinforce the need for the Water Authority to continue its strategy to diversify the region's water supply portfolio. This strategy is already reducing our region's exposure to supply shortages and rate volatility, and will continue to provide increasing benefits for the region over the next decade."

Veteran's family can keep Commemorative License Plates under new bill

A bill by Senate Republican Leader-elect Bob Dutton (R-Rancho Cucamonga) to honor surviving

family members of Purple Heart and Legion of Valor recipients passed unanimously in the Senate Transportation and Housing Committee.

Senate Bill 1295 will allow family members of Purple Heart and Legion of Valor recipients to keep the commemorative license plates after the veteran and their spouse are deceased. Under current law, surviving members must return the special plates within 60 days after the death of the recipient or the spouse.

"It only makes sense that these special license plates have been awarded to honor the sacrifices these California veterans have made should stay with their families," Senator Dutton said. "Rather than having the state dispose of these special license plates, this bill will allow them to remain in the family as an heirloom to honor the veteran's distinguished service."

Senator Dutton pointed out that existing law already allows commemorative license plates to remain with family members for those veterans who have received the Medal of Honor or were Prisoners of War.

"Veterans and their families have made some extreme sacrifices to help preserve the freedoms of this country," Senator Dutton said. "It is an honor to carry this bill that will allow family members to keep these license plates honoring the service and sacrifices of their loved ones."

Sunrise Power Link meeting

El Monte Valley was a busy place on Saturday, April 10 when community members gathered at the Hazy Meadow Ranch to discuss a number of issues which will directly effect their lifestyle.

The issues under discussion included the Sunrise Powerlink, the petition drive to remove two of the Lakeside Fire Board members, the proposed formation of an El Monte Fire Safe Council and the El Monte Valley Mining Reclamation and Groundwater Recharge project.

The Sunrise Powerlink is a subject the people of El Monte Valley are well acquainted with. The group was given an update regarding efforts to stop the powerlink from being placed in the valley.

Members from the action group Lakeside First gave an update on how the petition signatures for the recall of Fire board members Johnson and Bingham are being collected. A group spokesperson explained why they feel the board members unjustly fired Fire Chief Mark Baker.

El Monte Valley has seen the horrors of wild fires and flooding and hope to form a Fire Safe Council similar to Eucalyptus Hills and Blossom Valley fire safe groups. Both groups work closely with the Lakeside Fire District to form committees and coordinate before, during and after a disaster.

The General Manager from Helix Irrigation, Mark Weston, gave the group a project description of the proposed El Monte Valley Mining Reclamation and Groundwater Recharge Project. The project will have three major elements. The first element is surface mining of 12 million tons of material (sand) over a 10 year period in El Monte Valley. The second element is groundwater recharge of up to 5,000 acre-foot per year using highly purified recycled water with groundwater recovery at the same site in the El Monte Valley. The third element is the restoration of the site to be planned and coordinated with the reclamation as an end use on the same property.

The citizens of El Monte valley had a number of questions regarding well water, metered water, sand mining, raise, valley fever and the number of years the project will take.

The General Manager assured them this was just the first of many meetings before the project would have the final ok.

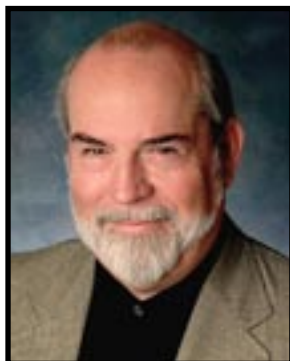

His participation in the outrageous comedy duo of Cheech & Chong during the 1980s made Cheech Marin's name instantly recognizable even today. His talents virtually exploding in many directions, Marin has excelled as a musician, actor, writer, director, art collector and humanitarian. And, he says, "I'm not done yet."

"I was in little league in 1957," Marin said. "I played catcher and then switched to short stop so when they won the World Series I totally related to it. These kids were incredible. They had a love of baseball but they didn't have shoes, bats, baseballs or any equipment. Yet they had desire and with practice went all the way and won the whole thing."

It's the priest in Monterrey who gets behind the kids and pushes them beyond their expectations. Marin said that was the only role that fit him age wise and he snapped it up. Marin was so passionate that

this film get on the big screen, he endured filming the entire movie twice.

"We started in Monterrey and filmed the movie a few years ago and then the financing fell out," Marin said. "Then we got new backers and a new director and filmed the entire movie again in the states."

Marin stuck with the film because he believes in the message of the movie. "It's a story about belief in so many things," he said. "Mostly faith, as exhibited by this priest who got the entire town together around these kids to encourage them. It's was all these things that gave the boys the drive to accomplish what they did."

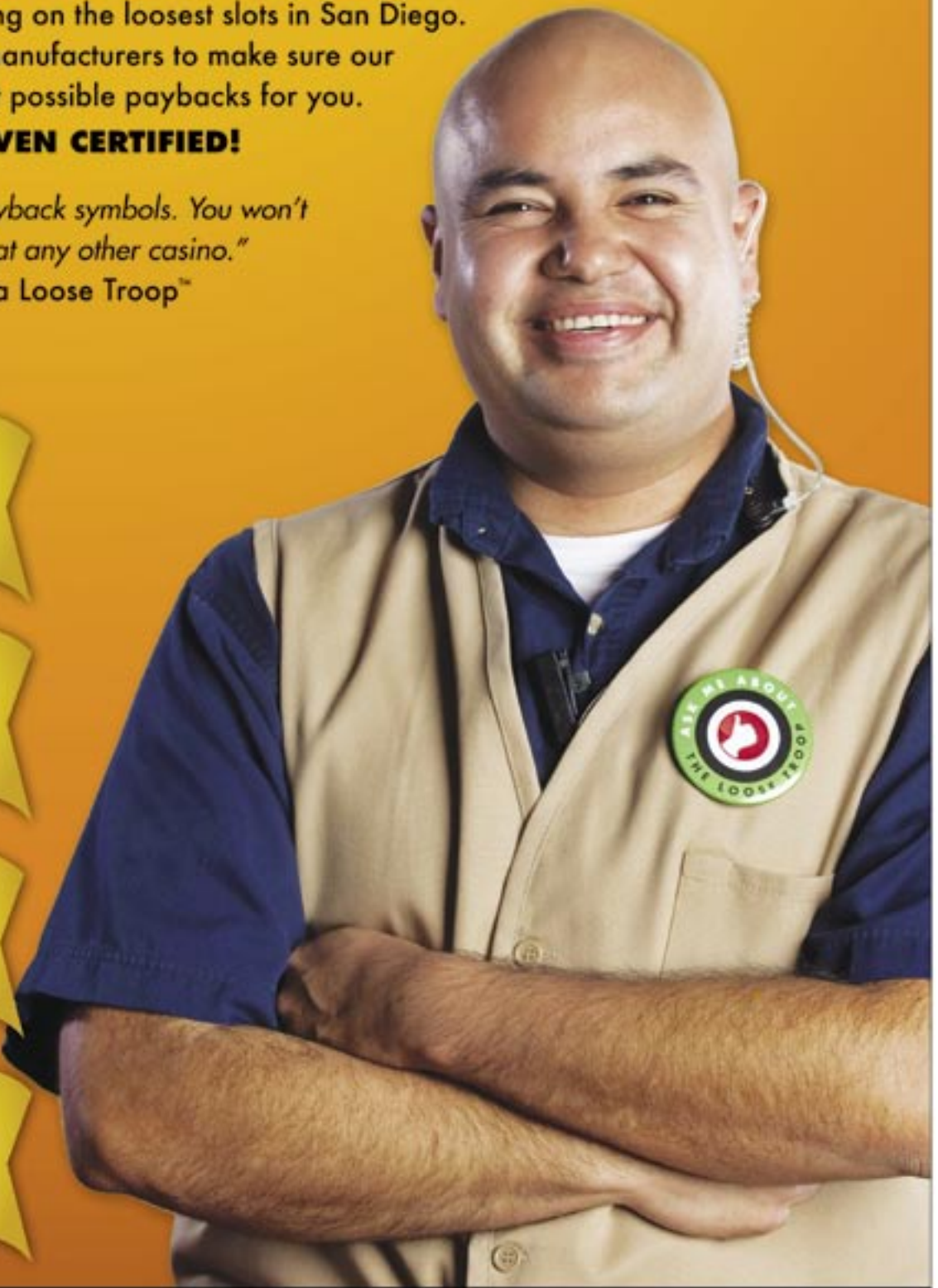

'Date Night' — better than expected

Expecting another one of those one-note comedies about mindless people getting together for a date, I wasn't thrilled about seeing *Date Night*. While there is still a lot of mindless comedy and some very silly situations that viewers need to just say – okay, I'll believe that for now – Tina Fey and Steve Carell managed to up the status of these usually predictable movies.

Claire (Fey) and Phil (Carell) Foster are a typical suburban couple – happily married and raising two children. They haven't really noticed that their sexual trysts are as programmable as a TV guide, and they really pay little attention to each other. After their good friends announce they're get-

ting a divorce, Claire and Phil begin to take a second look at their lives.

When Claire comes into the room beautifully attired for their weekly and boring date night at a local restaurant, Phil decides on the spur of a moment to take Claire to one of New York City's very popular restaurants. Arriving there they learn there are no tables available. Phil handles that when he decides they'll become the Triplehorns, a name called three times for a table but evidently whose party did not show up.

Phil and Claire indulge in luxury and play their favorite game of picking strangers and making up "their story." Suddenly two large men approach their table, demanding they follow them into the alley. Although the couple thinks

they're in trouble for being imposters, they quickly learn a far worse fate awaits them. It seems the Triplehorns are in big trouble with mobsters, and nothing Phil and Claire can say convinces the thugs they are not this couple.

The film becomes a fast-paced slapstick comedy as the Fosters get in and out of one

dangerous situation after another. I can't say that Fey (*The Invention of Lying*) and Carell (*Dan in Real Life*) display great chemistry together, but they are both talented comedians – and in this movie they work exceptionally well together in every scene. Some situations are very far-fetched but either made believable by Fey and Carell or are so entertaining it

doesn't matter.

Some big star talent including Mark Wahlberg (Holbrooke), James Franco (Taste), Mark Ruffalo (Brad), Mila Kunis (Whipit) and Ray Liotta pop up in the mind-boggling story which definitely adds to the silly plot. A buffed up Wahlberg appears as a shirtless and sexy past acquaintance of Claire's that she calls on to help her and Phil when their life is threatened. What they do to him is incredible and every time Phil yells for him to put on a shirt it brings even louder laughs from the audience.

Shawn Levy (*Night at the Museum*), an amazing comedian in his own right, does a great job in his direction of this comedy. He keeps the plot just this side of trite. I'm happy to recommend *Date Night* for pure escapism, but it's probably best suited for viewers over 17.

The ethnic stations include Mexican, Chinese, Mongolian, American, Rotisserie and Italian sections each that feature a nice variety of selections. The Mexican station will not disappoint

those who love great carne asada, specially prepared meat for tacos, beans and wonderful toppings as well as fresh made tortillas. The seafood section offers plenty of fresh choices including fish and oysters, but the crab legs are one of the most sought out items in the buffet. The Chinese options include dim sum, orange chicken, egg rolls and many oriental favorites but diners can't seem to get enough of the marinated BBQ spareribs. Over in the Mongolian station are more spicy entrees and also the availability to pack your own veggies and meet choices to throw on the big Mongolian wok.

There's nothing wrong with the American station where diners revel in choices such as tender flank steak, French fries, fried chicken and of course delicious mac and cheese for kids of all ages. In the Rotisserie station attendants are eager to slice up some prime rib, baked ham or turkey to accompany diner's picks of items like green beans, mashed potatoes and gravy and more. Among the Italian selections are manicotti, meatballs, ravioli and garlic shrimp pasta and some of the best garlic bread I've found in San Diego. Each dish is prepared with wonderful cream or tomato-based sauces and comparable to fine dining restaurants in San Diego.

If that's not enough there's

a salad and desert station bigger than some restaurants. The salad area features all the normal salad selections as wells soups, cheeses, sushi, and many delightful surprises like the glazed nut mixture available for salads. One has to see the desert bar to believe everything that's offered. Numerous slices of cakes and pies along with puddings, cookies and other deserts line the shelves. There are also candy bits, a chocolate fountain to dip marshmallows or strawberries into, éclairs, flan, ice cream and canoli. Diner favorites – and mine too – are clearly crème brulee and bananas foster.

Along with the great food, the Seasons Fresh Buffet is a pleasant dining experience.

Depending on when you go, there can be a lineup but the seating area is so big, the line moves quickly. Seating is available at tables, booths and can accommodate large parties. I've always found the service excellent. The restaurant is visually pleasing with greens and wooden wheels accenting different areas. The stunning décor of blended tiles and dining and kitchen accessories create inviting food stations. The bold blue tile work of the Mexican station suggests authentic and bold flavors. Over at the Rotisserie area the green and gold accents offer a sense of upscale expectations. The muted green tile work at the Mongolian section backs up its freshness and tasty entrees. The jazzy dark blue of the Ameri-

can station reflects a mood of traditional red, white and blue. The striking red tile décor of the Chinese section evokes its spicy delights.

The current price for the Buffet is \$20.99 but special prices are offered regularly. Club Barona members get a discount depending on which player's club card they hold. 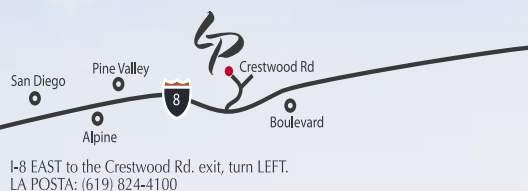

2010 Honda Crosstour 2WD EX-L

Honda seems to be having a vehicle dilemma – is it a station wagon-SUV-or crossover? I went to Tipton Honda to pick a test car and found the staff very accommodating. They chose a 2010 Honda Crosstour EX-L. There are two standard models – the EX and the EX-L. Both models come with either two wheel drive or all wheel drive, but there is only one engine available. It's a sporty little 271 horsepower 3.5-liter single overhead camshaft 24 valve i-VTEC V6 with variable cylinder management that puts out 271 pound foot of torque. Transmission choices are limited to one; a five speed electronically controlled automatic transmission with overdrive and a cool device called Grade Logic Control, which is great for climbing the streets of San Francisco or mountains. This package averages 18 MPG in the city and 27 on the open road; a little low, but doable.

multilink suspension, variable assist power steering, and front and rear stabilizer bars. The vehicle sits on four 18x7-inch alloy wheels and 225/60 R18 all season tires.

The Crosstour interior offers touches of wood trim and leather throughout. The center dash is busy with climate and audio controls readily assessable. I found the sound system fabulous, and that could have had something to do with the interior space and high ceiling. Night driving is a real pleasure with a blue backlight along with the low light gauges. The steering wheel has controls along with the dash and driver door controls, and seat heaters are standard on the Crosstour

EX-L.

As far as safety goes the Crosstour hit the bull's eye by making five stars in the frontal crash test for the driver and passenger as well as the side crash test for the front/rear seat passengers. It earned a four star in rollover protection. The car has front and side air bags, a rollover sensor, vehicle stability assist, ABS brakes, plus brake assist with electronic brake distribution. In addition there's a tire monitor, active head rests, and side bars in the door plus daytime running lights and child restraints.

I jumped in the back seat and found it very comfortable.

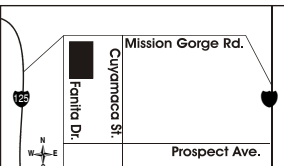

My six-foot frame fit in quite well. Another standard feature I liked was the release handles that flip the second row seats down and flat for more storage space. The Crosstour base price is \$32,570. My test model

priced at \$33,280 plus tax and license. The only option on the Crosstour was XM Radio. The only downside to this vehicle is the base warranty, a three year or 36,000 miles. 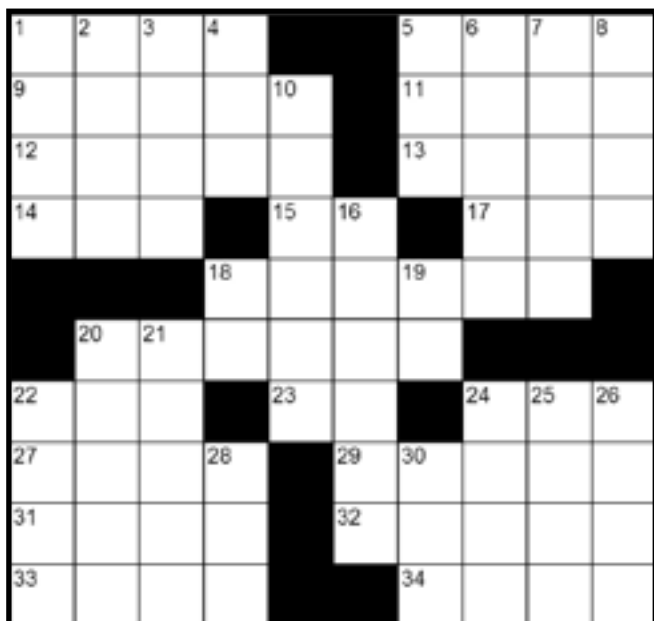

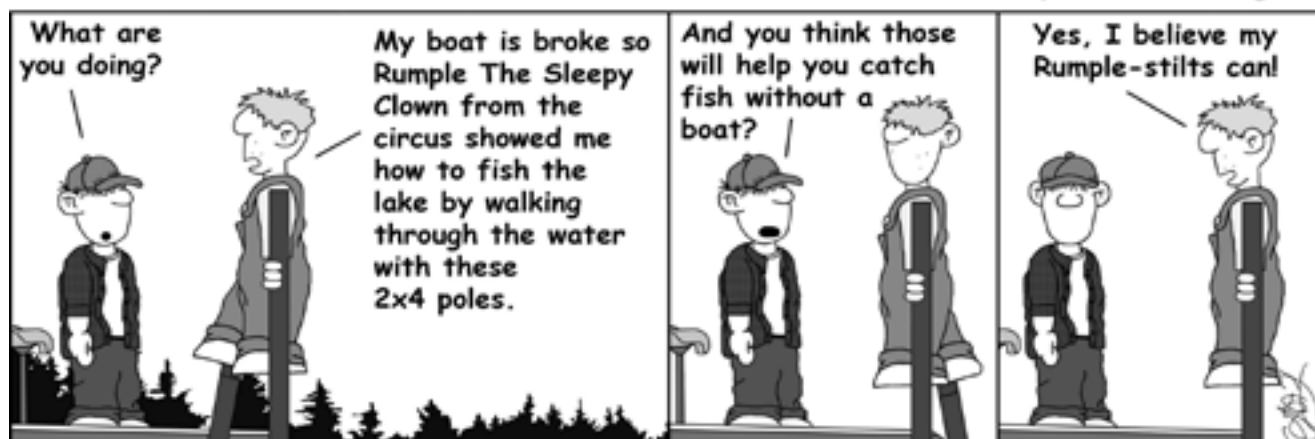
